

THE MINI ONE-GALLON CHALLENGE.



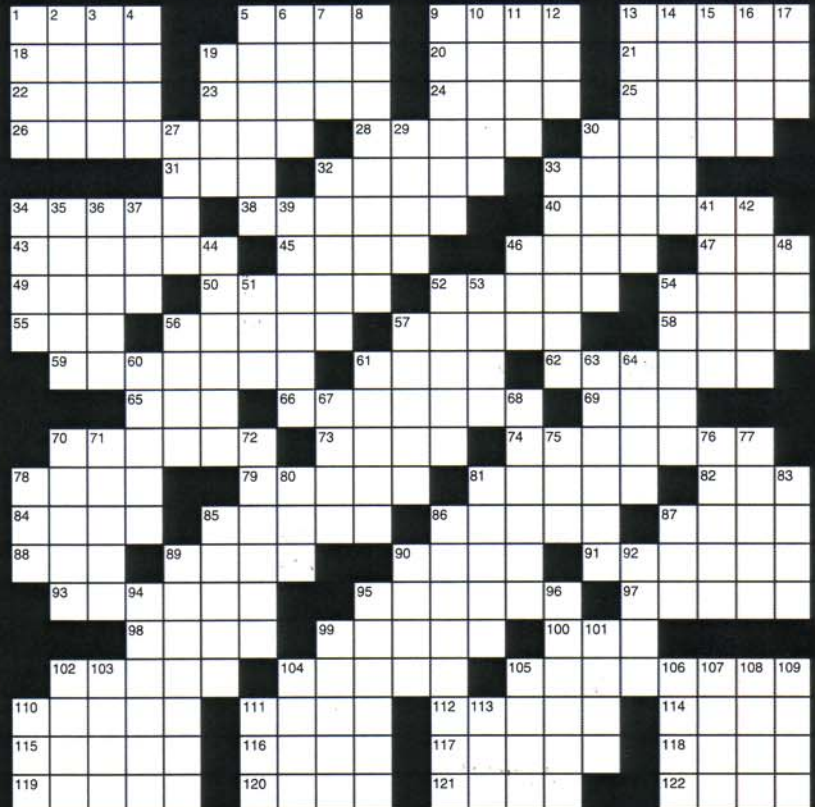
